Handcrafted using red sandalwood—a cherished material in Imperial China, it is a stunning example of traditional

Chinese carving. This major exhibition was organized by the Smithsonian Museum's Conservation Institute, with assistance of the China Red Sandalwood Museum, and the Savannah College of Art and Design. The pavilion will be on view for one year. Join us for receptions, related exhibitions, community events, and education programs.
